**FROM OUR RECTOR**

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, Father Joseph leaves us again as he now begins some intensive training in Italian and then his study of Canon Law at the beginning of October. Please keep him in your prayers as the undertaking of these academic studies is challenging, but to do so during the time of a pandemic is even more so.

If you come to the 8:00 am Mass during the week, you may notice a lot more activity around the old school building. Over the summer, Rosati-Kain High School faced some significant challenges as they sought to fulfill the requirements of social distancing and keep their students safe. With the use of our old school building, they are able to create a safer environment for the girls to learn and keep them in school for in person learning as much as possible. Their maintenance crew and parents have done a magnificent job bring the school back to life for this academic year.



This Friday, we premiered a new website for the Cathedral Basilica Parish and I hope you have an opportunity to take a look. It not only presents a more updated image of the Cathedral Basilica Parish, but hopefully provides information that is easily accessible.

I hate the phrase “perfect storm” however, it is exactly what happened this past Wednesday as a large storm hit the St. Louis area about 10:00 a.m. With all the rain over the past week, and with the amount of rain that was coming down at an alarming rate, we had water leak in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. It was caught early, and we attempted to alleviate the problem by releasing some of the pressure outside.

In this “perfect storm”, the water on the roof, which drains into a pipe that connects to sewer drain, could not drain because the sewer was pushing water back from the street and up the roof drain. The water was then pushed back on and under the roof into the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. We will be monitoring the chapel over the next few weeks to assess the damage.

Next Sunday, August 23, we will host a farewell Mass for Archbishop Carlson at 2:00 p.m. All are welcome, but because of limited space, it is a ticketed event. Please visit our website to secure your reservation if you wish to attend.

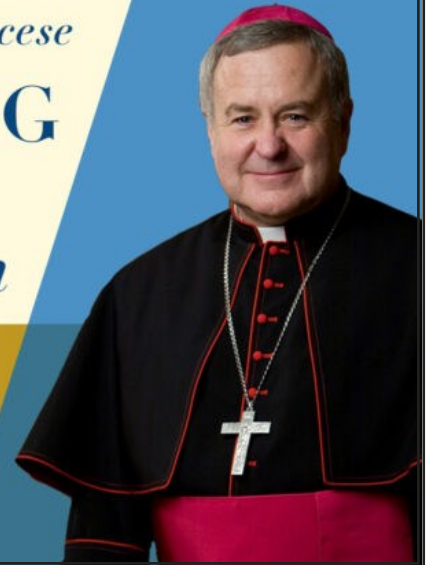

Eucharistic Exposition

The Blessed Sacrament, the very presence of Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist, is reserved in the tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel to the east of the main sanctuary. At all hours the Cathedral is open, people may be found praying there before the Lord "face to face." **Each Saturday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m., the Eucharist is displayed for prayer and adoration in public exposition in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel for a holy hour.** Following this holy hour, the Evening Prayer of the Church with Benediction is celebrated.

Additionally, the Blessed Sacrament is displayed for public adoration and prayer on the First Friday of the month. First Friday Adoration **begins at approximately 8:30 a.m., following the completion of the 8:00 a.m. Mass, and concludes with Benediction at 11:45 a.m.** Our next First Friday Adoration will be held on **Friday, September 4.**

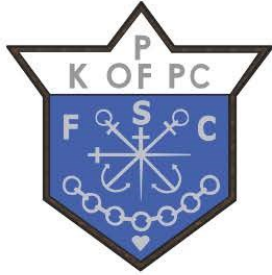

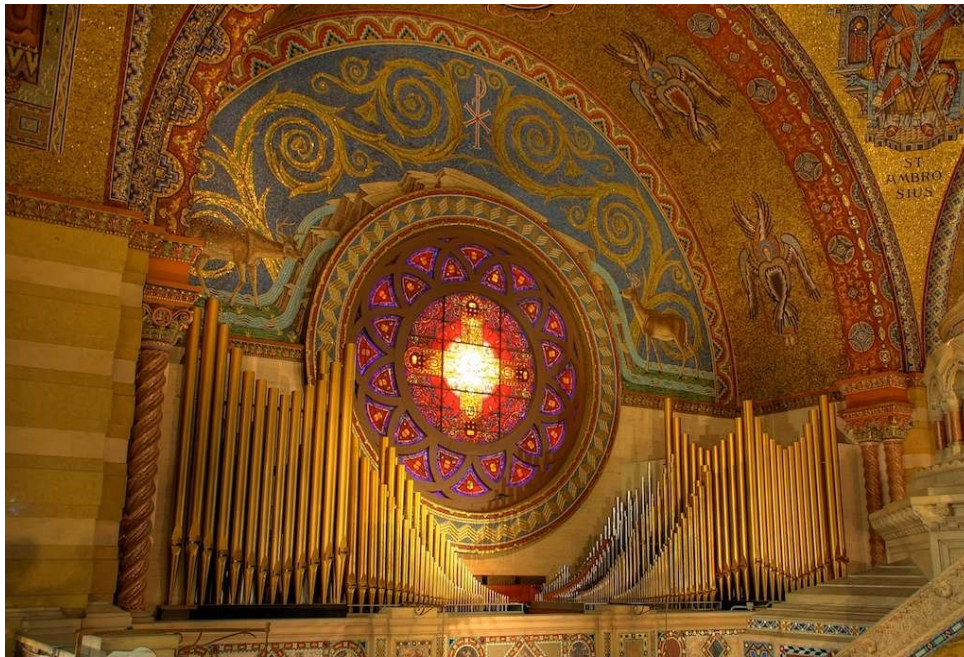

Why A Registered Parishioner

Due to the number of requests for baptisms and weddings, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy years ago that generally requires parents to be registered parishioners of the parish before their infant may be baptized here, or for an engaged person to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony.
