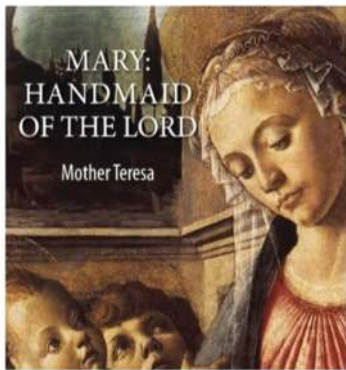

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis has the great honor of hosting the Memorial Service for Officer Tamarris Bohannon, who was killed in the line of duty last Saturday. I had the opportunity to meet with the family to plan some of the details for the service, and his father shared with me a bit of his son's life and what a special young man Tamarris was to them. Each time before leaving home to begin his shift, he and his wife would pray together. I kindly ask you to keep Tamarris and his family in your prayers as they endure this great loss.



Please mark your calendars for next Sunday for our Annual Blue Mass that will be celebrated at the 10:00 am Mass. During this Mass, we will honor those employed in the field of public safety, which includes police officers, firefighter, paramedics, and corrections officers. Archbishop Rozanski will be the main celebrant for this Mass, and if you are unable to make it to the Cathedral, you will be able to join us for the livestream of the Mass at www.cathedralstl.org/live.

As we continue to move forward in this time of the pandemic, I wanted to share with you that I have made a temporary adjustment to our staffing. For the next few months, Sister Pat, who has been heading our gift shop, will be on a furlough. At present, we are unable to host large tour groups, and it is quite challenging to operate the gift shop with social distancing. Please know this decision was not made hastily, and that I have a tremendous amount of admiration for Sister Pat. She is strongly supportive and devoted to the mission of the Cathedral. In this time of furlough, Susie Irons will be handling any inquiries for tours that may come in.



Deacon Eddie Godefroid has made his way back to Rome to continue his studies, and we will have to wait till Christmas to see him again. With his departure, the Archdiocese has appointed Deacon Christopher Rumbach of the Diocese of Wichita to be our new transitional deacon in service to the Cathedral. Alert for National Holiday

Monday, September 7, is Labor Day, a day on which our nation honors working people. It also typically marks the end of the summer vacation season. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Have you ever thought about becoming a Catholic? Do you know someone who might be interested in becoming Catholic? Are you interested in finding out more about the Catholic Church? Is your spouse, fiancé, neighbor, or friend interested?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (or RCIA) enables those who are interested in the Catholic faith to “find out what it is all about”. Most often, people come because they are invited. Be the voice of Christ and offer the first invitation to someone you know who might be interested in the Catholic faith! RCIA is for persons who have never been baptized, were baptized in another Christian tradition, or were baptized Catholic but have never celebrated Confirmation or received First Communion.

The Blue Mass

On September 29, 1934, a tradition of showing gratitude to emergency responders began when a Catholic priest from the Archdiocese of Baltimore organized the Catholic Police and Firemen’s Society while stationed at St. Patrick Church in Washington, D.C. On that September day, over 1,000 police and firemen, dressed in their blue uniforms, attended a Mass that has since come to be known in churches across the country as the “Blue Mass”.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis continues that tradition of gratitude as we celebrate the **Annual Blue Mass next Sunday, September 13, at 10:00 a.m.** Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski and the pastoral staff of the Cathedral Basilica invite all to join us in prayer, seeking God’s blessing upon those who serve and protect.

A New Face Around The Cathedral

Deacon Christopher Rumback of the Diocese of Wichita and son of Bill and Ana Rumback of Hutchinson, said it is surreal to him that his ordination is just around the corner.

“This year Jesus has continued opening up my heart, preparing me to receive this awesome gift,” he said. “While I’m not perfect, I’m confident that he’s going to work through me, making up for where I lack. That brings me and my brother seminarians so much peace, knowing that it’s all about him, not us.”

Rumback, who is studying at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary, said most of his pre-ordination preparation was complete before the pandemic began to affect his seminary community.

“My biggest realization so far has been that in times of crisis, our priorities remain the same: my openness to God’s will and readiness to serve others should still be what guides me, no matter what,” he said. “It’s easier to see the true heroism of priestly ministry in times of crisis. If anything, the current situation attracts me to the priesthood even more.”

He said any young man considering the priesthood should pray with these three questions in mind: What brings me joy, more than anything else? Am I willing to embrace the hardships of my vocation, like Jesus embraced the Cross? Jesus, how are you calling me to fatherhood?

The Archdiocese has assigned Chris as our new transitional deacon in service to the Cathedral, and he will begin his time with us next weekend, September 12-13. Please join us in extending to Chris a heartfelt Cathedral Parish welcome!

Why A Registered Parishioner

Due to the number of requests for baptisms and weddings, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy years ago that generally requires parents to be registered parishioners of the parish before their infant may be baptized here, or for an engaged person to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony. If you attend Mass at the Cathedral regularly, call the parish office for more information on how to get registered today!

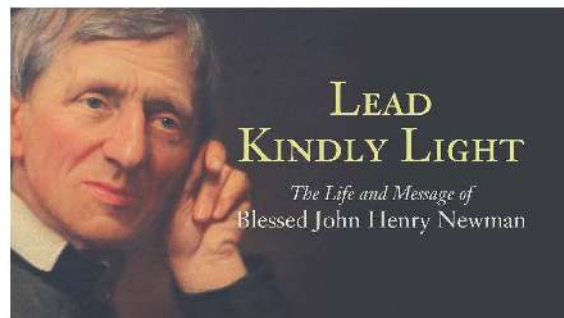
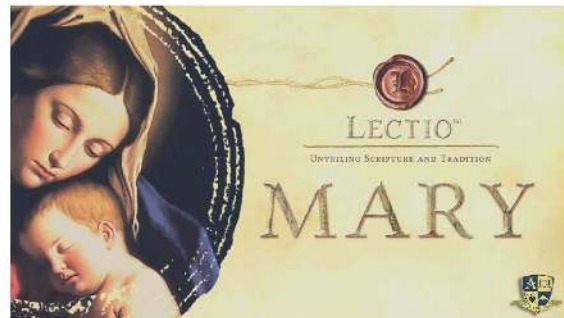
