FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday, we celebrated the great Solemnity of Pentecost and hosted the last Confirmation for the Easter Season. The total celebrations of the Sacrament of Confirmation held at the Cathedral Basilica this year were fifteen. There is an immense amount of planning, from scheduling the parishes to contacting lectors, that takes place before the Easter Season. My deep gratitude to our staff and our volunteers who arrived an hour before each confirmation, placed pew reservation markers and welcomed visitors with a smile.

This Monday, we gather to celebrate Memorial Day at our 8 am Mass; we honor those who have given their lives in the service of our country. War should always remind us of the call the Lord gives to us in the Gospel, to be people who work for peace, to be people who work for the right ordering of society, for the ordering of society according to the plan of God, not according to the plan of man.

The only way that there will ever be peace within our world is if all peoples are converted to the message of Jesus Christ - if our hearts and minds are transformed to live our lives according to God's plan and not our plans. We must constantly propose the truth of the Gospel to the world, inviting them to come to know Jesus Christ. When we honor the dead and those who have gone before us, we, too, remember the tremendous sacrifices they have made. We remember how many of them have been scarred for life, whether physically or emotionally.

On Saturday, May 29th the Cathedral Basilica hosted the Ordination to the Priesthood of six men for the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Please join me in wishing them all the best as they begin the life of priestly ministry. I would ask you as well to pray for them and for all priests.

O Jesus,
 I pray for Your faithful and fervent priests;

 for Your priests labouring at home
 or abroad in distant mission fields;
 for Your tempted priests;
 for Your lonely and desolate priest;
 for Your young priests;

Preach the Gospel with both words and actions

God's revelation and Jesus' preaching came to people in words and deeds

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We celebrate a series of witnesses this week. St. Justin Martyr gave witness to the Gospel by refusing to sacrifice to idols in 2nd century Rome. St. Charles Lwanga gave witness to the Gospel by refusing to comply with the king's immoral sexual agenda in 19th century Uganda. St. Boniface gave witness by proclaiming the Gospel and knocking down pagan shrines in 8th century Germany.

These saints raise a question: What does it mean for us to give witness to the Gospel in 21st century Missouri?

Many people instinctively turn to the quote generally attributed to St. Francis: "Preach the Gospel always. If necessary, use words." But I want to say, words are necessary if we're going to give witness to the Gospel in our day.

Our lives are full of words. We live by e-mails, texts, blog posts and Google searches. Words are a central feature of every part of our lives. It's absurd to take this one area — faith — and to suggest that we don't need words there.

That's not to say by any stretch that words are the first and last thing when it comes to proclaiming the Gospel. They're not! Deeds need to come first and last. But if we stop for a moment and think about the relationship between words and deeds in our lives, we can see that both are needed.

Words without deeds are cheap. Words alone are a shallow witness to what we believe. Deeds provide depth to words of love, and likewise to words of faith. Deeds show that we really mean what we say.

But deeds without words are often unclear. Words explain why we do what we do. If deeds show that we really mean it, words show what it is that we mean. The words "I love you" and "I forgive you" and "I'm sorry" really matter. So do the words of faith.

In the Old Testament, God's revelation always came to people in words and deeds. In the New Testament, Jesus always proclaimed the Gospel in words and deeds. That's why the Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "The divine plan of Revelation is realized simultaneously by deeds and words which are intrinsically bound up with each other and shed light on each other." (CCC, 53)

The great witnesses we celebrate this week proclaimed the Gospel in words and deeds. That's our call as well.

In times when faith is all talk and little action, the St. Francis quote is a worthy challenge: don't let your faith be words without deeds.

But in a time when people overlook the importance of words, we need a new challenge and a new motto: Preach the Gospel always, in word and in deed.

Eucharistic Exposition

The Blessed Sacrament, the very presence of Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist, is reserved in the tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel to the east of the main sanctuary. At all hours the Cathedral is open, people may be found praying there before the Lord "face to face." **Each Saturday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m., the Eucharist is displayed for prayer and adoration in public exposition in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel for a holy hour.** Following this holy hour, the Evening Prayer of the Church with Benediction is celebrated.

Additionally, the Blessed Sacrament is displayed for public adoration and prayer on the First Friday of the month. First Friday Adoration begins at approximately 8:30 a.m., following the completion of the 8:00 a.m. Mass, and concludes with Benediction at 11:45 a.m. Our next First Friday Adoration will be held **next Friday, June 4.**



On Sunday, June 6, faithful of the entire Archdiocese are invited to join Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski and the priests of the Cathedral Basilica for the traditional Corpus Christi Procession, which will immediately follow the 12:00 noon Mass.

Altars dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and to St. Joseph will be set up on the grand plazas of the Cathedral Basilica & the Catholic Charities building.

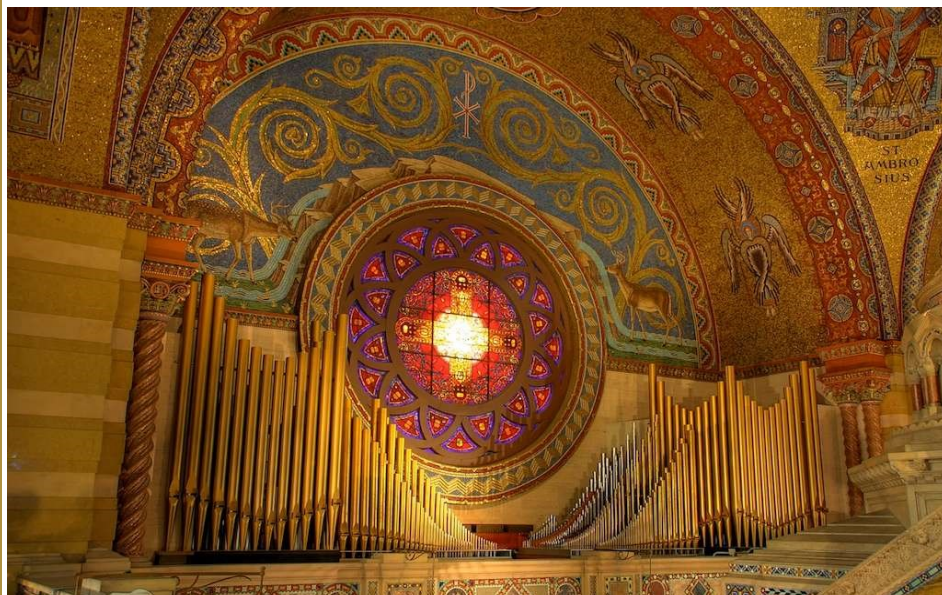

Most Holy Trinity- The Triune God

I have often heard priests tell me that this solemnity is one of the most difficult days in the liturgical year on which to preach a good homily. It is difficult to preach a homily on such a central mystery of our faith like the Trinity. What is essential to remember for all Catholics is to simply listen to the readings and each of the prayers today for the Mass. Within these texts we can find spiritual insights about the Trinity. For example, the preface for the Mass today provides a great summary of the Church's teaching on the mystery of the Trinity: "For what you have revealed to us of your glory we believe equally of your Son and of the Holy Spirit, so that, in the confessing of the true and eternal Godhead, you might be adored in what is proper to each Person, their unity in substance, and their equality in majesty." One God in three Persons is always there for us.

Why A Registered Parishioner

Due to the number of requests for baptisms and weddings, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy years ago that generally requires parents to be registered parishioners of the parish before their infant may be baptized here, or for an engaged person to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony. If you attend Mass at the Cathedral regularly but have not yet registered, call the parish office for more information on how to get registered today!

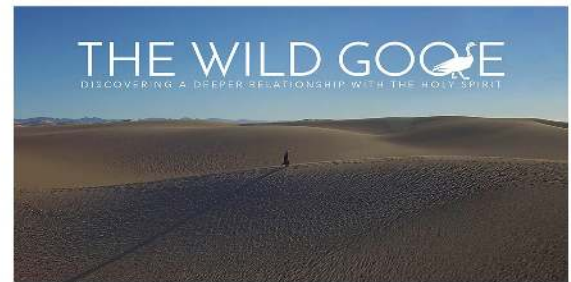

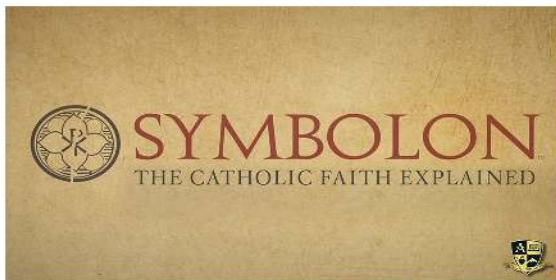
THE WILD GOOSE: GOD'S LOVE POURED OUT
