FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The light that shone in the night at Christmas illuminating the city of Bethlehem, where Mary, Joseph and the shepherds remained in silent adoration, shines bright today and is manifested to all. The Epiphany is a mystery of light, symbolically suggested by the star that guided the Magi on their journey.



In the mystery of Christmas, Christ's light shines on the earth, spreading, as it were, in concentric circles. First of all, it shines on the Holy Family of Nazareth. The Virgin Mary and Joseph are illuminated by the divine presence of the Infant Jesus. The light of the Redeemer is then manifested to the shepherds of Bethlehem, who informed by an Angel, hasten immediately to Bethlehem and find there the "sign" that had been foretold to them: the Child, wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger (cf. Lk 2: 12).

Finally, Christ's brightness shines out, reaching the Magi. The Magi worshipped a simple Child in the arms of his Mother Mary because in him they recognized the source of the twofold light that had guided them: the light of the star and the light of the Scriptures. In Him they recognized the King of the Jews, the glory of Israel, but also the King of all the peoples.

During this Christmas Season, I could clearly see that the Cathedral Basilica parish community is a vibrant community. This is seen in so many ways, from our parishioners' response to our Advent Giving Tree to how so many will reach out to each other after Mass. Thank you for all you do to make the Cathedral a great parish.

Part of what makes us great are many dedicated volunteers who assist in various ways. One of these volunteers, Victor Stewart, is with us every weekend welcoming visitors, assisting with the collection and ushering. Shortly after Christmas day, Victor was diagnosed with a brain tumor and he will no longer be able to continue to help in that capacity. This is a great loss for the Cathedral, but for the man who has assisted countless visitors, let us now assist him with our prayers.

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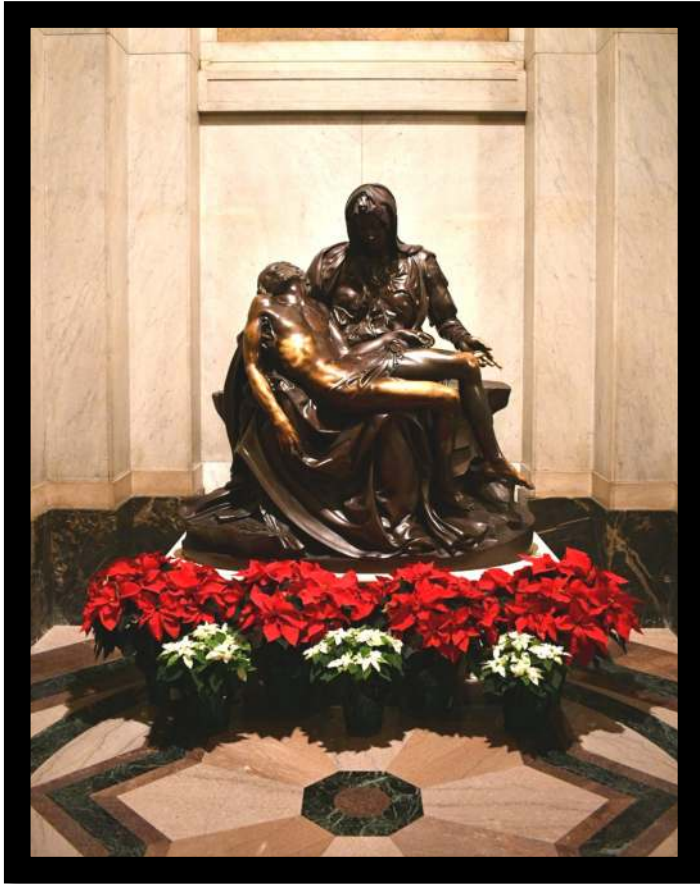

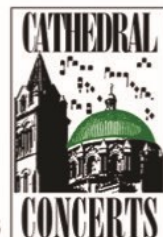

Eucharistic Exposition

The Blessed Sacrament, the very presence of Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist, is reserved in the tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel to the east of the main sanctuary. At all hours the Cathedral is open, people may be found praying there before the Lord "face to face." **Each Saturday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m., the Eucharist is displayed for prayer and adoration in public exposition in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel for a holy hour.** Following this holy hour, the Evening Prayer of the Church with Benediction is celebrated.

Additionally, the Blessed Sacrament is displayed for public adoration and prayer on the First Friday of the month. First Friday Adoration begins at approximately 8:30 a.m., following the completion of the 8:00 a.m. Mass, and concludes with Benediction at 11:45 a.m. Our next First Friday Adoration will be held **Friday, January 7th.**

Respect Life Memorial Mass

January 22 marks the 48th anniversary of the court decision that legalized abortion on demand throughout the entire nine months of pregnancy. **On Saturday, January 15 at 10:00 a.m.,** all are invited to the celebration of the Annual Roe V. Wade Memorial Mass and Prayer Vigil to pray for the protection of all unborn children who are in danger of abortion; for wisdom, strength, and fortitude for their mothers and fathers; for the conversion of all those who participate in the abortion industry; and for parents, family members, and friend who have suffered as a result of an abortion experience, that they may find hope and healing.
