FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of Jesus' Presentation at the temple 40 days after his birth. It places before our eyes a special moment in the life of the Holy Family: Mary and Joseph, in accordance with



Mosaic law, took the tiny Jesus to the temple of Jerusalem to offer him to the Lord (*Lk* 2: 22). Simeon and Anna, inspired by God, recognized that Child as the long-awaited Messiah and prophesied about him.

A tradition that occurs on the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord is the blessing of candles; hence, it is also called Candlemas. We will bless the candles prior to the beginning of the Saturday Evening Mass and Sunday 10 am Mass. for use in the Cathedral for the following year.

Not by chance has the church chosen the wax candle as a type of her Lord and Master. St. Anslem of Canterbury, tells us the reasons: "The was product of the virginal bee, represents Christ's most spotless body; the wick enclosed in the wax, and forming one with it, images His human soul, while the fame, crowning and completing the union of wax and wick, typifies the divine nature, subsisting with the human nature in one divine person."

In addition to the candles we will bless for the Cathedral will bless extra candles that each family may take home with them. These candles are for your private use in the home to burn before a crucifix or an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to remind us that our souls, like it, ought to the consuming earthly affections in the pure heaven-aspiring flame of love.

Bringing her Son to Jerusalem, the Virgin Mother offered him to God as a true Lamb who takes away the sins of the world. She held him out to Simeon and Anna as the proclamation of redemption; she presented him to all as a light for a safe journey on the path of truth and love.

This past Friday we celebrated the funeral for Larry Bradford who was a beloved parishioner of the Cathedral. As the family mourns this loss, I would kindly ask you to pray for the repose of Larry's soul and for the family in this most difficult time. May they find comfort and strength in the love and support of our faith community.

ARCHBISHOP'S COLUMN

Jesus Offers Us Immunity from Eternal Death

In order to live the life Jesus offers us, we need to embrace the daily disciplines of Christian life

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We celebrate the feast of St. Blaise this week (Feb. 3). He's the patron saint of protection from every illness of the throat — a fitting feast for cold and flu season!

If you could pick a patron saint for some cultural illness of the world today, what would it be? Personally, I think we could use a patron saint for making the best — rather than the worst — of other people's statements and actions. What would our news shows, talk shows and conversations be like if our first step was to put the best interpretation on the actions and intentions of others?

Speaking of illnesses, we're coming up on the fifth anniversary of the "COVID shutdown." I mention that not only because it's a fact of the calendar but also because of something St. Irenaeus says in the Office of Readings this week: "Only by being united to one who is Himself immune could we be preserved from corruption and death." Interesting: The notion of immunity is not only a modern medical concept, it was also a theological concept in the ancient world.

I wonder if that provides an avenue for presenting the Gospel today. Our culture seeks vaccination against a great variety of illnesses. That's fine. Vaccination is a great blessing of modern medicine, even if it's not an unmixed blessing.

What's interesting is that a culture rightly interested in preventing earthly illness doesn't seek vaccination against the ultimate illness of eternal death. Jesus wants to share His life with us — a life that allows us to pass through death into heaven. Why does a culture that seeks temporal vaccination turn away from this eternal vaccination?

Remember, too, that "saving from death" isn't a new feature of God's relationship with His people. St. Augustine, reflecting on the connection between

Passover and baptism, said: "The doorposts of the Jews were sealed with the blood of the slaughtered animal; with the blood of Christ our foreheads are sealed. And that [ancient] sealing — for it had a real significance — was said to keep away the destroyer from the houses that were sealed; Christ's seal drives away the destroyer from us, if we receive the Savior into our hearts." God offers the most powerful immunization ever!

Christ's life was paradoxical. As Hebrews 12 says, God appeared to ancient Israel in thunder and lightning on the mountain. Though scary, that made a certain amount of human sense! But in Jesus, God comes to us quietly — in the flesh, on the cross, in the Eucharist and in the poor. That takes some getting used to!

So, too, Christ's life in us is paradoxical. We receive His life in what appears to be bread and wine but is really Him. We receive His instruction in what appears to be simple words but are really the Word. We meet Him in what appear to be beggars and the sick, but are really Him in disguise. Maybe that's why people turn away.

Hebrews 12 also tells us: "For the sake of the joy that lay before Him Jesus endured the Cross." That's not so foreign to us: We see athletes who endure the discipline of training for the sake of some victory.

The question becomes: What are the daily disciplines of the Christian life, and how do we embrace them to stay with the life that Jesus offers us? That's key, because here's the thing: When we stay with His life, He offers us immunity from eternal death.

Blaise was a hard-working bishop dedicated to encouraging the spiritual and physical health of his people in Sebastea, Armenia.

Although the Edict of Toleration which granted freedom of worship in the Roman empire had been signed five years prior, religious persecution still raged in the country.

According to a legend, a mother came to him with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Bishop Blaise's command, the child coughed up the bone.

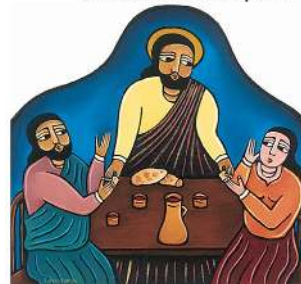
