Dear Parishioners,

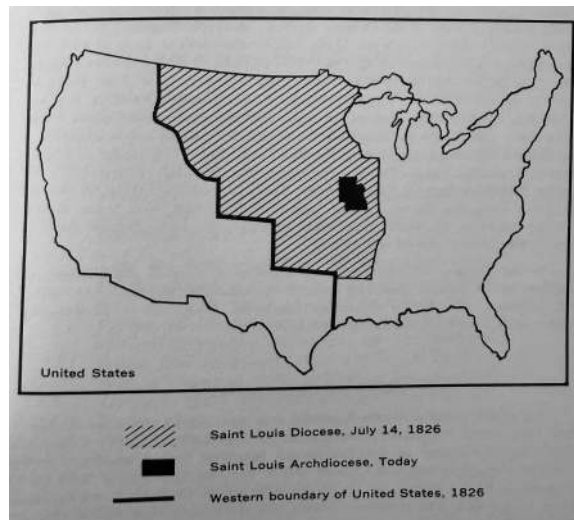
This weekend, the Archdiocese of St. Louis joyfully celebrated the 200th anniversary of its establishment as a diocese on July 18, 1826. As we mark this historic bicentennial, we give heartfelt thanks to the countless bishops, priests, deacons, religious women and men, and lay faithful whose faith, dedication, and sacrifice have shaped the life of our local Church over the past two centuries. Their unwavering commitment to proclaiming the Gospel, serving those in need, and building up the Church has left a lasting legacy. With profound gratitude, we honor their generosity and pray that we may continue their mission with the same faith, courage, and hope for generations to come.

We are especially honored to welcome His Excellency Archbishop Gabriele Giordano Caccia, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, as the principal celebrant of this historic Bicentennial Mass, with His Eminence Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Archbishop of New York, serving as the homilist.

This celebration is made even more historic by the presence of Archbishop Rozanski, Archbishop Emeritus Carlson, Cardinal Raymond Burke, and Cardinal Justin Rigali—all of whom have served as shepherds of the Church in St. Louis. Their presence together is a powerful sign of the continuity of apostolic leadership and a fitting tribute as we give thanks to God for 200 years of faith, service, and mission in the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

Below you will find a map of the Archdiocese of St. Louis. It invites us to imagine the immense territory of the original diocese when it was established in July 1826 from the Diocese of Louisiana and the Two Floridas. This vast missionary territory was entrusted to Bishop Joseph Rosati, the first Bishop of St. Louis.

ARCHBISHOP'S COLUMN

A Short Answer from the Depths of Our Hearts Can Invite Further Unpacking

When we speak of matters of faith, we can use the example of Jesus & the saints, who frequently used short sayings & potent images

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

If you had 30 seconds, what would you say?

I ask because several of the Gospel passages in these late July weeks are just about that long (or that short!).

Jesus tells the parables of the sower, the mustard seed, the yeast, the weeds in the field and the net thrown into the sea. Each of those lasts about as long as a television commercial.

The prophet Jeremiah also gives us short sayings and potent images. For example, describing the Lord's people, he says: "They have dug themselves cisterns, broken cisterns that hold no water." He might well be describing our digital addictions! And he gives us the image of the potter's house: a few moments in the telling, but a lifetime in the unpacking.

We celebrate the feast of St. Mary Magdalene on July 22. Her message can be spoken like a lightning flash: "I have seen the Lord."

We celebrate the feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola on July 31. Each of his "Rules for the Discernment of Spirits" can be stated in 30 to 60 seconds, yet books have been written about them.

We know how to give short messages that invite further unpacking in so many areas of our lives. That movie was awesome. I read a really good book. Best burger ever! I tasted an excellent wine. The museum has a cool new exhibit. I just heard a great musician in concert.

But then when it comes to the Gospel, we get tongue-tied.

SERVE THE LORD WITH GLADNESS

The world asks us poignant questions: What is heaven like? Why should I be concerned about sin? What does life look like as we draw toward God or away from God? We think we need a 30- or 60-minute infomercial, prepared by specialists and tested with focus groups, to answer such questions.

What if what the world needs instead is an answer that comes from the depths of our hearts? "I'll give you 30 seconds — put it in a nutshell for me!"

Pope Leo, in his new encyclical, "Magnifica Humanitas," says that our approach to artificial intelligence can either be like building the Tower of Babel or like rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem after the exile. That's a powerful image! It can be stated briefly, then unpacked at greater length — and the Holy Father does that unpacking through 245 paragraphs!

July 19-25 is Natural Family Planning awareness week. How would you state the importance of NFP for a Catholic approach to marriage in 30 seconds?

We'll be voting on Amendment 3 this November. How would you state the Catholic approach to Amendment 3 in 30 seconds?

Someone asks you, "What difference does it make to follow Jesus, as long as I'm a good person?" How would you respond and invite someone to deeper discipleship in 30 seconds?

Jesus was a master of this approach to the world's great questions. Let's study the readings these weeks; they offer lessons on how to follow Him. And, as we learn from Him, let's practice doing it ourselves as we respond to the questions people ask us.

Why A Registered Parishioner

Due to the number of requests for baptisms and weddings, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy that requires parents to be registered parishioners before their infant may be baptized here, or for an engaged person to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony. Infant Baptism

According to the mind of the Church, parents are obliged to see that infants are baptized within the first weeks after birth. As soon as possible after the birth, or even before it, parents should request the sacrament for their child and are to be properly instructed in preparation for it. Godparents are also encouraged to have baptismal preparation before the child is born.
